## President's Message

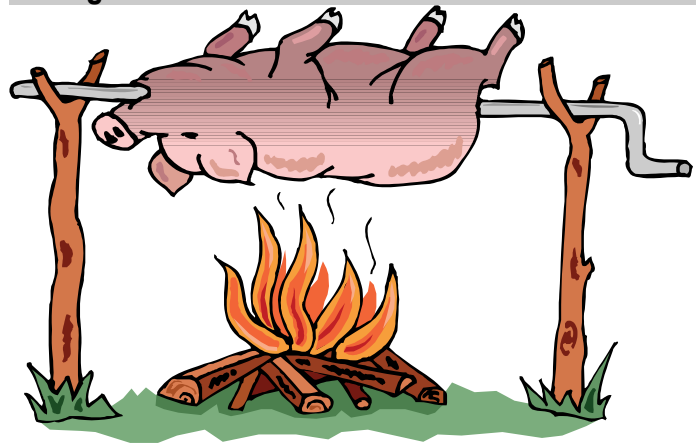
Two community and eight Board meetings later we're making headway on items of interest to the community.

## Animals



We've got barking dogs and loose animals. Most times just making your neighbor aware of the problem in a nice way will help. We have guidelines in our home-owner covenants and will contact the homeowner if you've been unsuccessful. The city and county have their regulations. In the case of loose animals, a partial reprint of the appropriate codes is below.

**County Code = Sec. 3-5. Impoundment of pets running at large;** disposition.

(a) Any pet or dangerous pet running at large may be impounded by the animal control officer or any of the persons empowered to enforce this chapter and transported to the county animal shelter, or to any other nonprofit animal shelter designated by county council, and there impounded and confined until redeemed or disposed of as hereinafter provided....

If you are a **county resident call Charleston County Sheriff's office at 202-1700** and they will contact animal control.

**City Code = Sec. 5-4. Animals at large prohibited.**

No person owning or having possession, charge, custody or control of any animal shall cause, permit or allow the animal to stray or in any manner to run at large in or upon any public street, sidewalk or park or upon the property of another, if such animal is not under sufficient strict voice control or physical restraint so as to allow the animal to be controlled; provided that no animal shall be allowed at or in an athletic field or athletic facility without such animal being physically restrained or leashed so as to allow the animal to be controlled unless the director of the department of recreation determines that during certain hours or under certain conditions at certain athletic fields or facilities, animals may be permitted to occupy such field or facility under sufficient strict voice control without physical restraint, in which case the field or facility shall be posted accordingly; and further provided that no animal of any kind shall be permitted on any tennis court or fenced playing field at anytime, even if such animal is physically restrained, leashed or otherwise controlled, or is under sufficient strict voice control. When any animal destroys or damages any property, attacks, threatens to attack, or interferes with any person in any manner, becomes a nuisance, or strays onto the private property of another, there shall be a presumption of law that the animal was not under strict voice control.

## Vehicles & Boats



Article II - Property & Use Section 3 of our covenants has several areas concerning stuff that can be seen from the street. Such as "No trash, rubbish, junk, stored material, wrecked or inoperable vehicles or similar unsightly items shall be permitted outside of an **enclosed** structure."

"Every attempt should be made by owners to store recreational vehicles (RV's), boats and trailers within enclosed garages or areas that are adequately concealed from the street and from any adjoining lot." There is an exception for temporary visiting guests with motor homes.
